#### Creation Justice-Why We Take Action for God's Creation

We are called to follow the example of Jesus and the prophets--to be courageous in proactively shaping our communities and our world to better align with our faith values.

*Creation Justice Ministries* specializes in helping Christian communities to engage at the federal level of US government.

In our U.S. democracy, engaging with elected officials is a civic responsibility.

- Directly Contact Decision-Makers: Creation Justice's form to plan and record your visit, call, or email your elected officials to express your concern for God's creation.
- **Get Published-** Efforts to care for God's creation are news-worthy. Write your opinion in the comments section of online articles, or formally respond to an article with a **letter to the editor**. Be an opinion leader by drafting a **blog post** or an **opinion editorial** to a local newspaper.
- Take Action with Creation Justice Policy Factsheets.
- Organize Your Community. Creation Justice Ministries sometimes helps faith leaders prepare testimonies to federal agencies, but this is an important practice to engage at city, county, and state levels also. Check out Creation Justice Ministries' guide to preparing testimony for a public hearing.

#### Choose one new thing you can do throughout the year to care for creation

- In a world that needs kindness and delight, <u>Positively Green Cards</u> delivers both, responsibly. These greeting cards are made from recycled material, printed with soy ink, and manufactured using green power. The company also donates 10% of their profits to organizations that care for the environment. **Make someone—and earth—happy!**
- Junk mail invades our lives to the tune of 41 pounds per person per year. Eighty to 100 million trees lose their lives each year to print junk mail, and much of it ends up in landfills. <a href="Stop junk mail.">Stop junk mail.</a>
